In addition to Guanajuato, Madrinas DEACERO started the Coahuila and Nuevo Leon chapters, extending the benefit of the program to a greater number of people.

3. More companies chose Fundación DEACERO to invest in

For the first time in its history, the foundation received donations from companies outside Grupo DEACERO for a common project: the repaving of an industrial corridor.

4. New systems for monitoring the foundation's work

We improved our data collection and monitoring mechanisms to propose better strategies to help us achieve our mission.

5. Best practices in early childhood were recognized

The Business Coordinating Council (CCE, in Spanish) recognized DEACERO, through its foundation, for its culture that promotes healthy early childhood and co-responsible parenting.

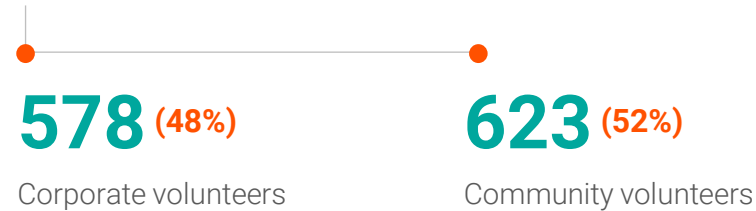

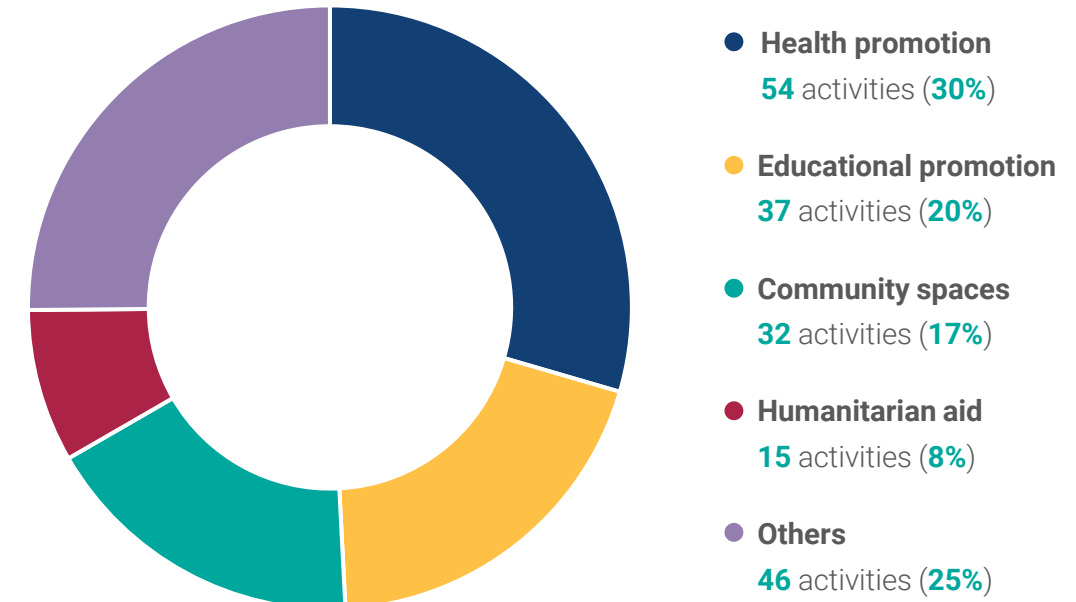

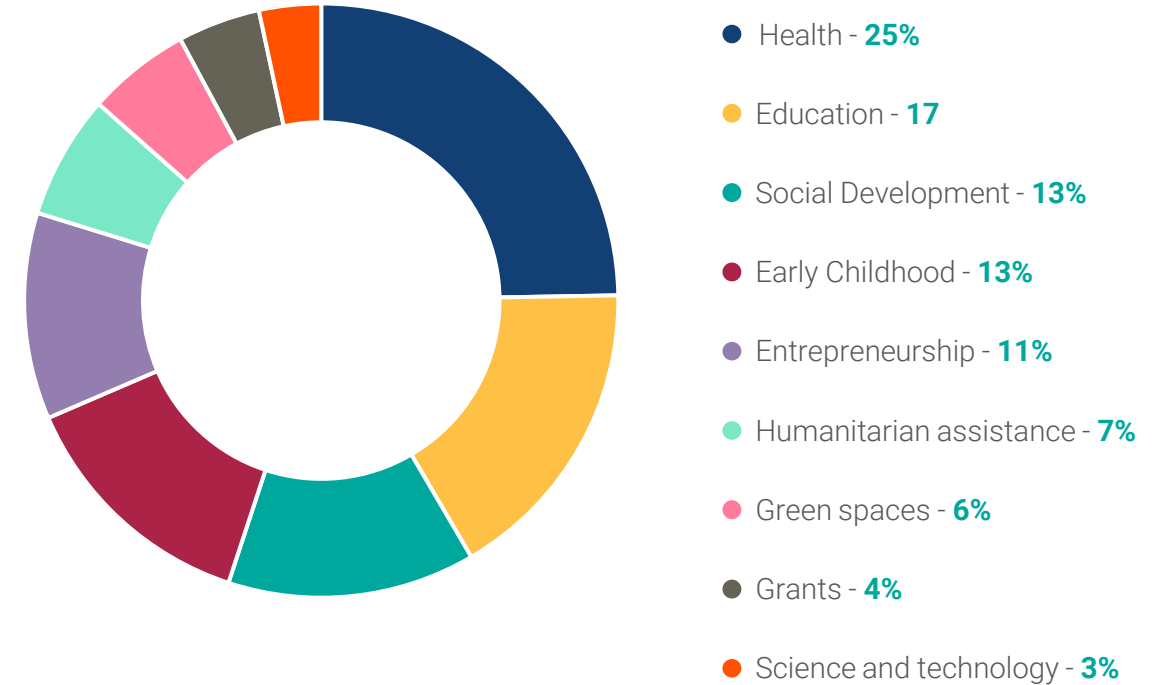

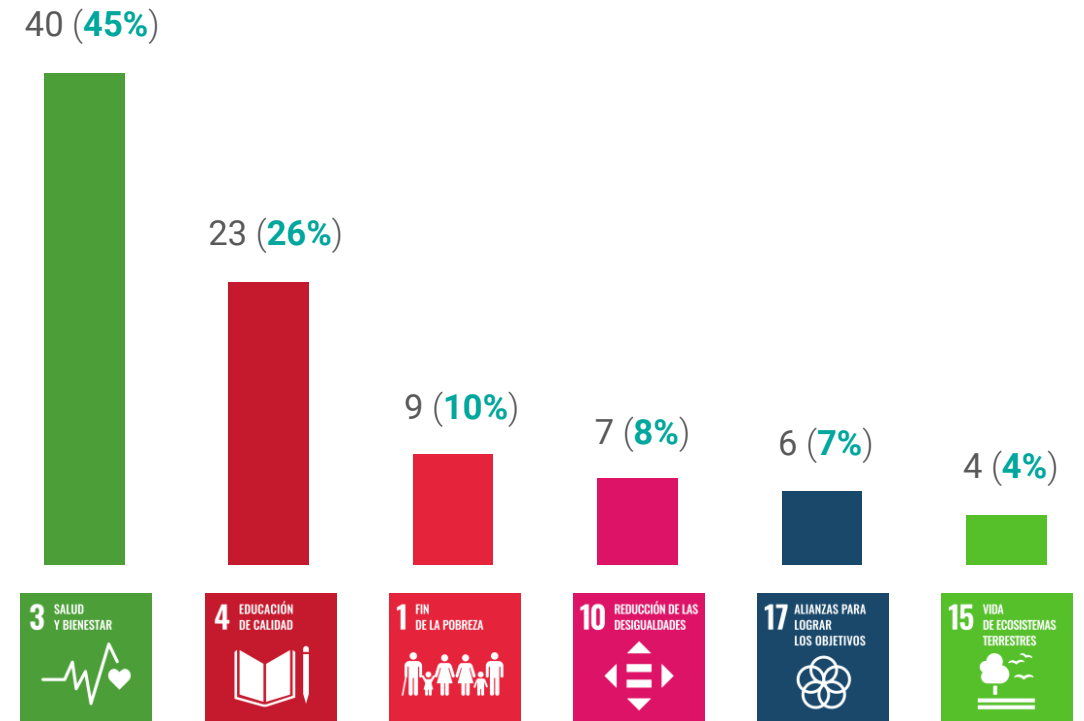


Distribution of donations by Sustainable Development Goal (SDG)

In the 2022 - 2023 school year, 8% of high school students dropped out¹ and so was Allison Banda, as her family was facing economic problems that prevented her from studying. But at the last minute she received great news.

The principal of the Santa Catarina Polytechnic High School (PPSC, in Spanish), where Alison was studying, called her and informed her that she was

eligible for a scholarship and would no longer have to suspend her studies due to lack of resources.

Alison finished high school and now that her situation has improved, she is attending the university. Like her, 63 other young people with financial difficulties have finished high school thanks to scholarships funded by Fundacion DEACERO at the PPSC.

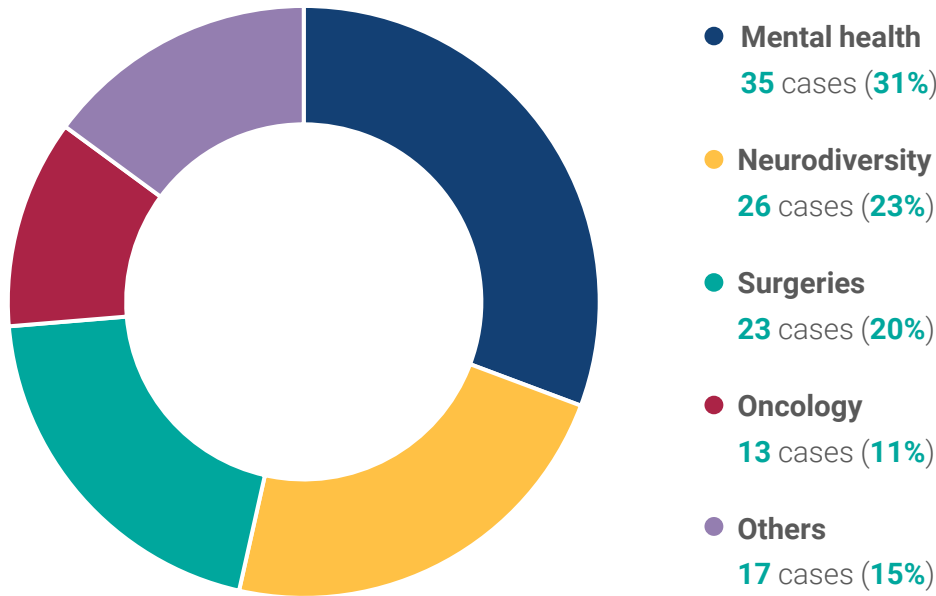

His HR referred him to Health Alliance and the arrangements to pay for the transplant expenses began, since they exceeded their financial capabilities. Hugo was also the organ donor.

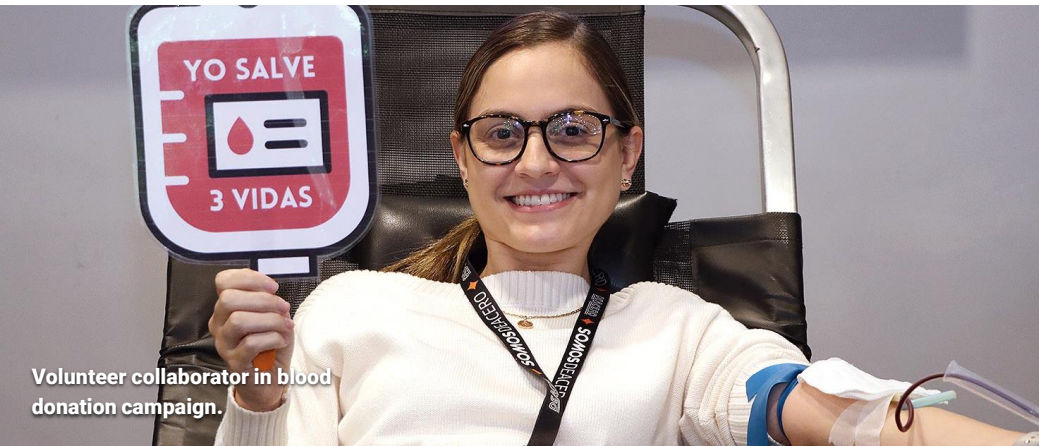
In collaboration with Celaya Steel Mill, which helped to expedite the necessary steps, Laura's kidney transplant surgery was successfully performed.

In September we carried out a reforestation in the Sierra de Arteaga, Coahuila, where 149 DEACERO volunteers participated, including employees and their families, located there and also in Nuevo León.

On that Saturday, September 9, 2023, 540 trees were planted to contribute to the reforestation of the sierra, with the hope that, in the future, the trees

themselves will stabilize the ecosystem with their ability to attract to attract rainfall.

This will not be the only visit. In the following years, more waves of corporate volunteers are expected to visit the site to continue planting and maintain the trees already planted.

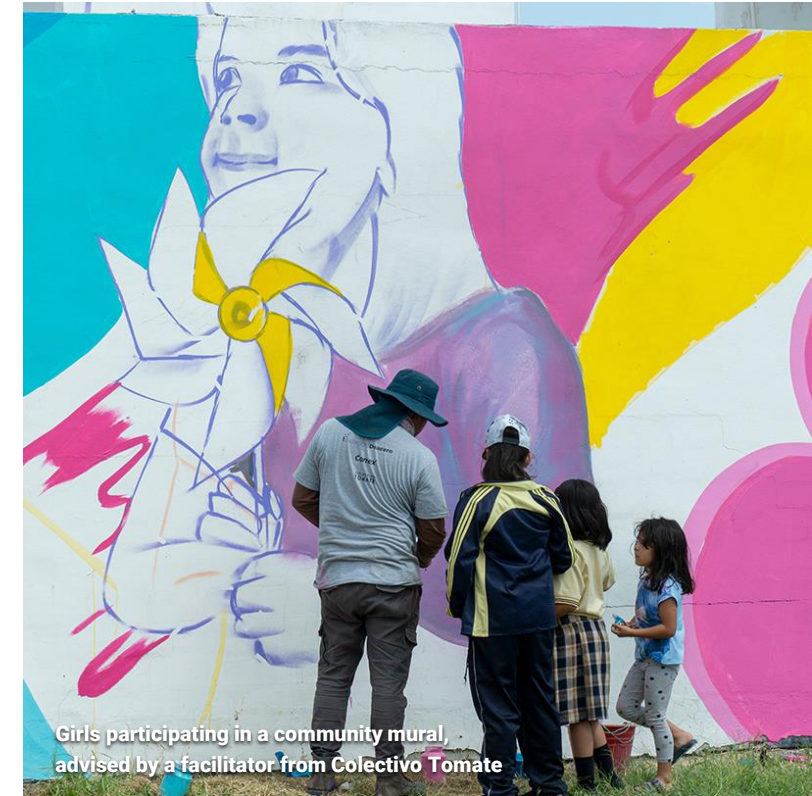

In collaboration with Colectivo Tomate, Comex and DEACERO Godmothers, we implemented the project "Consonante" in the communities of El Chinaco and El Rehilete, neighbors of the DEACERO Business Center cluster in Villagrán, Guanajuato.

Through recreational and cultural activities, the participation of 137 neighbors was activated to recover public spaces, although more changes

would be triggered within the people afterwards.

In addition to improving communication skills and trusting relationships between adults to solve problems together, some children transformed their life expectations through their contact with art, even considering new possibilities for their lives of exercising pro-social professions when they become adults.

In response to the humanitarian crisis in Guerrero caused by Hurricane Otis in 2023, we organized the "Together for Guerrero!" campaign. We called upon all employees to join efforts to send supplies and economic resources to the state.

Thanks to the efforts of the volunteers who made donations, 1,521 food drops, 900 brooms and 750 liters of drinking water were sent to Guerrero.

In addition, more than one million pesos have been donated to civil organizations that continue to help the victims.

DEACERO will continue to participate in humanitarian actions in the area, through non-profit organizations and other committees until a Guerrero as strong as steel is recovered.

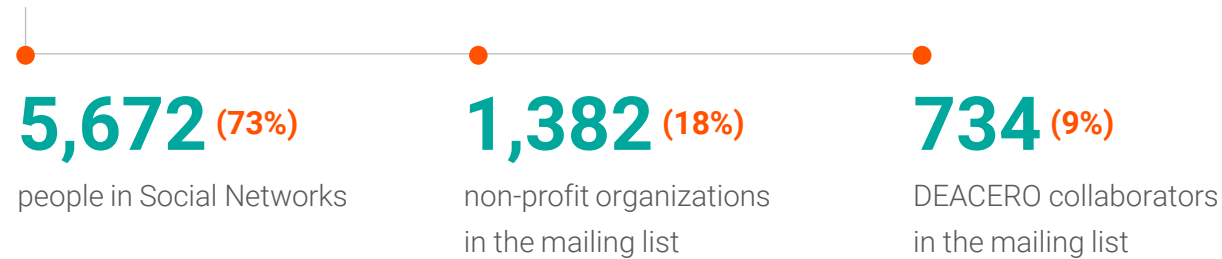

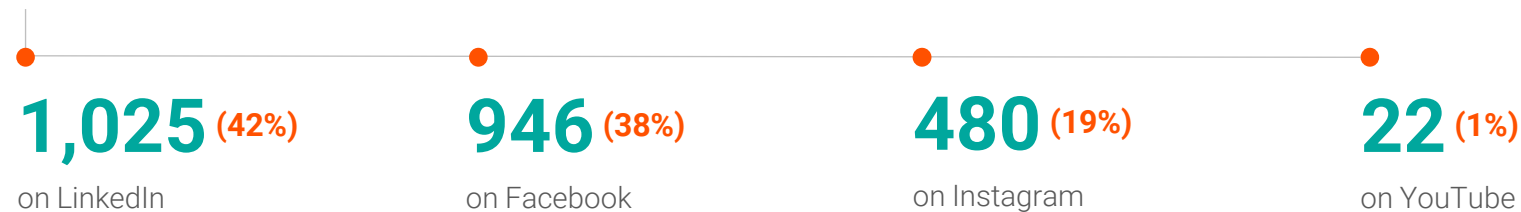

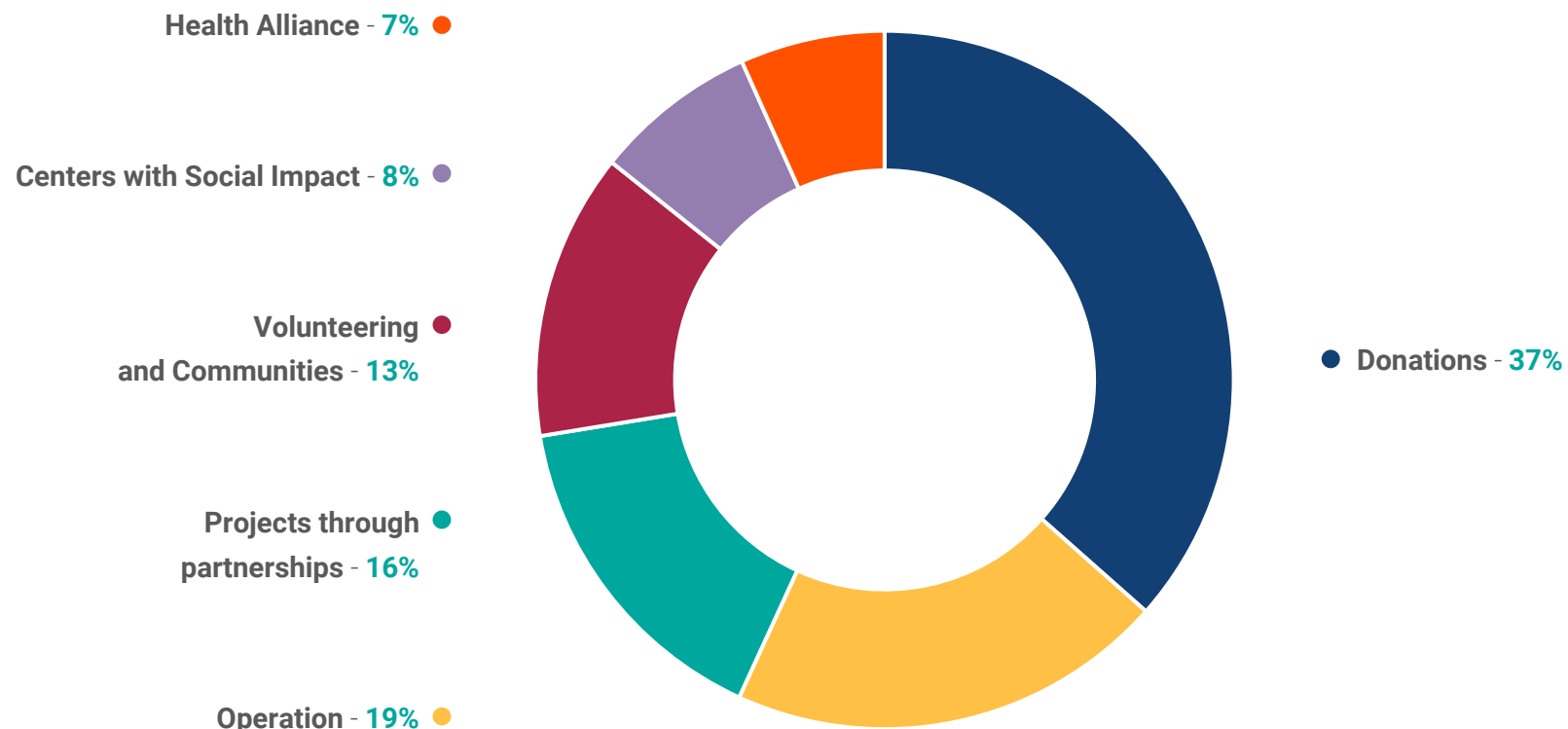
