I am pleased to share with you the Fundación DEACERO 2024 Annual Report, a document that reflects our commitment to the social progress of communities.

During 2024, we focused on optimizing our operating efficiency, reaching a remarkable 88%.

This achievement allowed us to allocate most of our resources directly to our social purpose. In addition, we began centralizing information in a CRM, which significantly improved the management of programs such as Health Alliance and Donations to CSOs. I would like to highlight some of the most important achievements this year:

- We increased donations to civil society organizations by 30%.
- We resolved 39% more Health Alliance cases, with a 42% faster turnaround time.
- We carried out 306 social actions, directly benefiting 15,339 people and indirectly benefiting 27,208.

I am deeply grateful to our collaborators, allies and volunteers, whose efforts and dedication are fundamental to achieve these results. At Fundación DEACERO, we reaffirm our commitment to continue working with transparency and efficiency to forge a better future for all, in a Mexico as strong as steel.







Fundación DEACERO promotes, through the supported CSOs, access to STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) education. To add to this purpose, we partnered with the Horno3 Museo del Acero and its extracurricular offer aimed at the educational community of public schools.

In 2024, we trained 25 teachers with a course to adapt their teaching practices in STEAM areas in order to promote educational innovation in their work. 25 children participated in medical, mechatronics and robotics diploma courses to stimulate their interest in these areas.

While the course increases teachers' capacity to educate with this innovative approach, for the majority of these economically vulnerable infants, it is an opportunity that could transform their future academic and professional vision.



Mónica is a social security beneficiary in Mexico who, like many others, has faced an increasingly common situation: not receiving care at her local clinic or hospital due to the lack of necessary resources.

Fortunately, Mónica's husband, who works at DEACERO, learned through his Human Resources agent about the Health Alliance program. He requested support so that his wife could address her cancer diagnosis, a situation that threatened both her health and her family's economic stability.

Thanks to the program, the necessary treatment was arranged for Mónica after verifying that social security could not provide timely care. Today, Mónica continues to fight her illness, but thanks to this help, her family can focus on providing her with the support she needs without the worry of gathering economic resources that are beyond their reach.

Guadalupe, Nuevo Leon

The Regional Maternal and Child High Specialty Hospital in Guadalupe, Nuevo Leon is one of the most equipped medical centers in Mexico to manage complex conditions in children. Every month, this hospital receives thousands of patients from all over the country. Although the services are free, many women face their situation in solitude and abandonment.

During a volunteer activity in December, DEACERO staff visited the hospital and contributed by creating a mural to brighten the children's environment. Inspired by this experience, a group of 20 employees decided to continue visiting the hospital once a month. Voluntarily, they continue to provide companionship to these women who face the health care of their children in an uncertain future.

Every week, at the Social Impact Center in the "El Rehilete" neighborhood in Villagrán, an enthusiastic group of girls, boys, and young people gather. United by classical music, these young people see in it the key to a future full of better life opportunities. They are part of the Villagrán Community Orchestra, an initiative led by the Conservatory of Music and Arts of Celaya that seeks not only to promote the personal and social development of its members, but also to strengthen the social fabric and community integration.

The orchestra, composed of 39 talented string musicians, represents an innovative and transformative project for all its members. Each rehearsal offers these young people the possibility to explore and expand their academic and professional horizons, overcoming preconceived expectations and the limitations imposed by their immediate environment.
